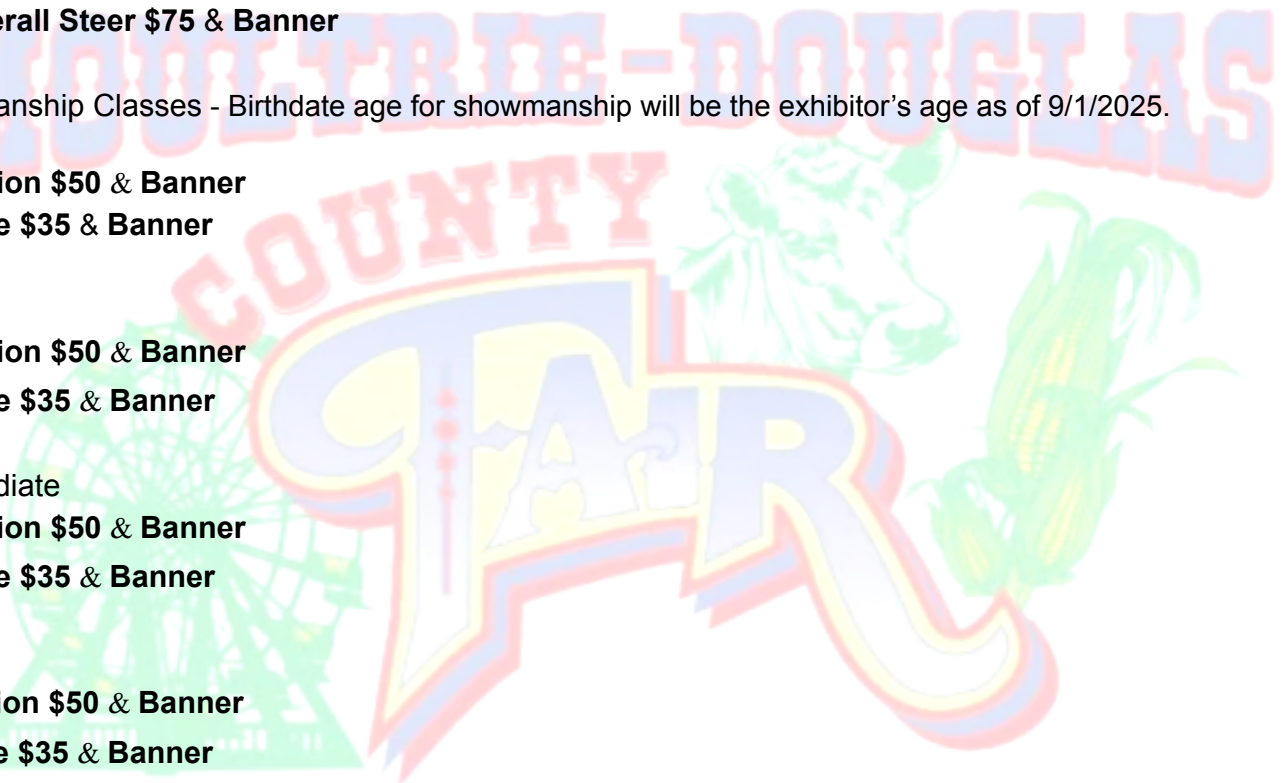

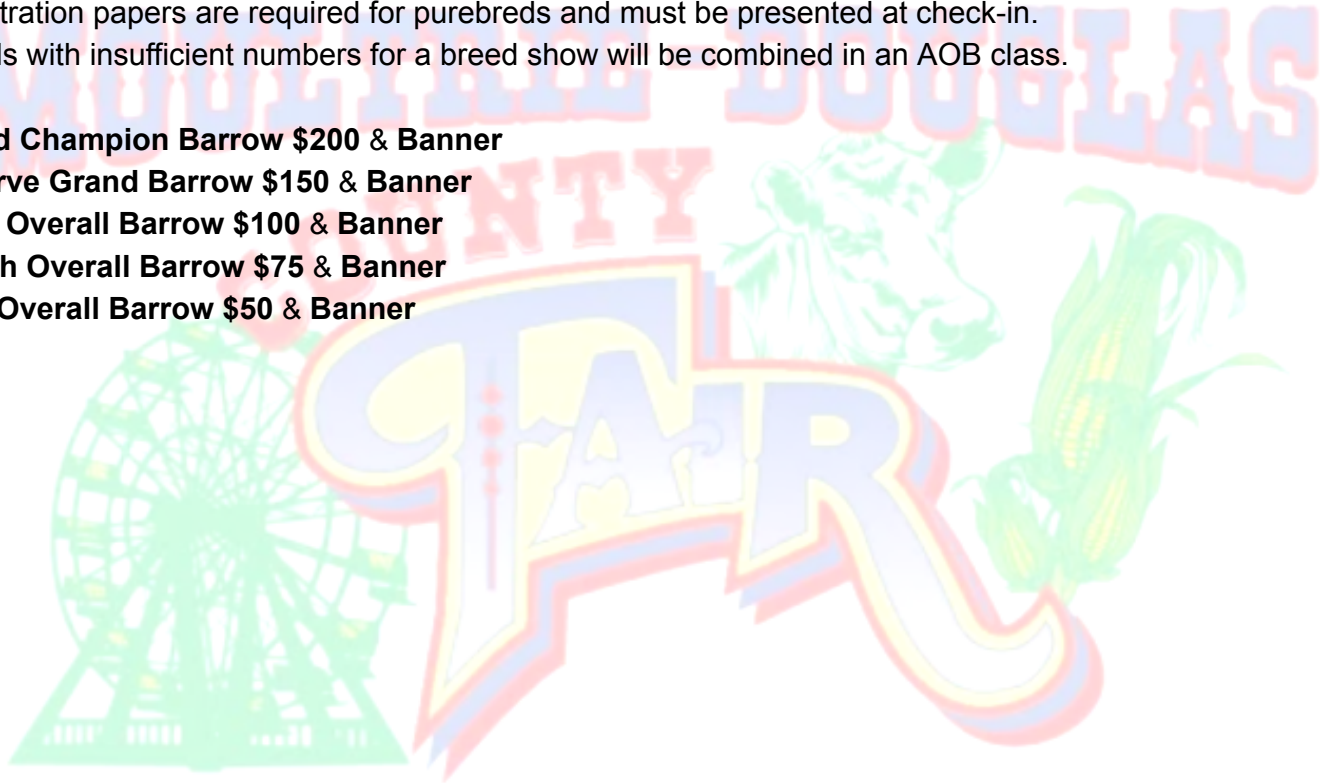

- Each show will include showmanship and the cost of entry is \$10.00 each show or at the discretion of show committee.
- **Exhibitors MUST show their own animal registered in their name upon entry.** No bucks will be shown in showmanship. Exhibitors can show wethers, wether dam (Slick or Hair) with milk teeth in place. **Exhibitors must show an animal that is registered as their animal on the day of the show.** No farm name or family nominations will be accepted.
- Prizes for each high point showmanship division winners at the end of the year.
- Prizes will be awarded at each show in the series for winners in each division. Prizes awarded by each individual show may vary depending on the show

Awards for the top two individual's does in each category will be recognized.

- Current membership is not required for participation in any of the doe shows. However ,only ILWS series members are eligible to accumulate points towards Premier exhibitor awards and overall doe awards.
- **The two highest placing doe's of an exhibitor will contribute to the individuals ILWS points per show.**
- The accumulated points of all shows will equal the total calculated points for the series.
- Youth may enter and show a maximum of four does (hair & slick-shorn) at any individual show unless otherwise specified by a specific show. 8 doe's total.
 - Youth must show their own does unless there are two or more does entered by the same youth in a particular class. This includes champion drives. **Must be ILWS member to assist in showing another members animal.**

If weights are declared and the hair is too long you will not show in your class points will be excluded for the entire show.**
- **Each entry will cost \$25 for each animal at the time of the show unless the show has existing entry fees.**
- Prizes in each division will be awarded at the end of the show.
- Highest two-point totals at the end of the year, regardless of age, will be awarded Grand and Reserve Overall respectively. The Grand and Reserve will each receive a special reward.

ETHICAL FITTING PRACTICES MUST BE OBSERVED AT ALL TIMES

The two highest placing wethers of an exhibitor will contribute to the individuals ILWS points per show.

- The accumulated points for all shows, will equal the total calculated points for the series
- Youth may enter and show a maximum of four wethers at any individual show unless otherwise specified by a specific show
- Youth must show their own wether unless there are two or more wethers entered by the same youth in a particular class. This includes champion drive.
- Wethers must have ownership declared before weigh-in and may not be entered or shown in another youth's name after being weighed-in. (**ALL Blankets must be removed before Weigh In**)
- Wethers must have all kid teeth still in place.
- **Wethers must be clipped to an even length (3/8 inch or less) above the knee and hock but excluding the head and tail switch. If weights are declared and the hair is to long you will not show in your class, points will be excluded for the entire show.**
- Wethers must have a band in place around the testicular tissue, exhibit no behavioral signs of still being an intact male, disbudded is preferred or encouraged but horns are not a disqualification.
- Each entry will cost \$25 each animal at time of registration.
- Prizes for each division will be awarded at the end of the show that day.
- The highest two-point totals at the end of the year, regardless of age will be awarded Grand and Reserve Overall respectively. The Grand and Reserve will each receive a special reward.
- The ILWS reserves the right to drug test any animal exhibited in a series show for any illegal substances.
- Participation is not limited to Illinois youth. Only Illinois residents can participate and accumulate points in the series.
- The Coordinator of each individual show reserves the right to refuse entry into the show to any animal that exhibits a transmissible disease, fungus, etc.; or to any individual or family not acting in an appropriate manner as deemed by the show committee without refunding any monies.
